The Teacher Education Assistance for College and Higher Education (TEACH) Grant program was created to provide up to \$4,000 a year to undergraduate and graduate students who agree to serve for a minimum of 4-years as a full-time “highly qualified” teachers in high-need fields in a public or nonprofit private elementary or secondary schools that serve students from low-income families.

The US Department of Education defines ‘high need’ fields for the purposes of TEACH Grant program eligibility as *Mathematics, Science, Foreign Language, Bilingual Education and English Language Acquisition, Special Education and Reading Specialist*. Students who are not pursuing a TEACH Grant eligible major must review the Teacher Shortage Area Nationwide Listing to confirm that their planned teaching area is considered a high-need field by state.

The TEACH Grant provides up to a maximum yearly amount of \$4,000 in grants (\$16,000 total for an entire undergraduate program) for full-time students. Due to the Budget Control Action of 2011 that resulted in federal sequestration, the maximum annual amount received will be reduced. See below for guidance for the 2026-27 reduced grant amounts:

Linfield’s Office of Financial Aid strongly recommends that only students who are committed to teaching a high-need subject in a designated low-income school upon graduation consider this grant. This teaching obligation must be completed in a public or nonprofit elementary or secondary school that is eligible for Title 1 assistance. If the 4-year teaching obligation is not met within 8-years of graduation, the grant will convert to an unsubsidized loan, which will have to be repaid with interest calculated back to the date the funds were disbursed.

The chart below shows an example of the interest charged and repayment amounts for a student who received \$16,000 of TEACH Grant funds and failed to meet the service obligation of the program.
